						 <p>IN CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776. A DECLARATION BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, In GENERAL CONGRESS ASSEMBLED.</p> <p>WE the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress assembled, do hereby declare that these United States are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connections with them are hereby totally dissolved; that as to the future, their political course should be directed to peace, commerce, and amity with all other States, as they shall see fit, without prejudice to their commerce with Great Britain, France, Spain, Portugal, Holland, Denmark, Prussia, and Russia, and that they have full power to send and receive Ambassadors and Consuls, to enter into all sorts of treaties, alliances, and confederations, to contract loans, and borrow money, to emit paper money, to make all laws which shall have the force and effect of the laws of the United States in all respects, to do all other acts and things which independent States may do, and to do the same in the name and in behalf of the United States of America.</p>
